2011 Budget Shortfall

As most of our congregation is aware, we were behind on our financial commitments for 2011. The Christmas offering was designated to help offset some of that shortfall. This offering brought in over \$14,000 which was a tremendous blessing and a huge help toward meeting these commitments. Unfortunately we still were not able to meet our obligation to the United Methodist New Jersey Conference. We ended the year just over \$18,000 short which represents approximately 4 months of apportionments to the conference. The United Methodist Women gave \$1,150.46 towards the deficit and United Methodist Men of our church gave \$1,300 from the Christmas tree sales. The Chancel Choir and Missions Committee also donated to bring the total down. Some members of the congregation have already donated bringing the total to \$8,171.97 as of January 29, 2012 that has been given toward this effort.

We support the ministries of the UNITED Methodist church through our apportioned funds. This method of giving has become a strong and generous tradition.

According the NJ Conference website “Together, through our connected congregations, we accomplish what no single church, district or annual conference ever could hope to do alone. In this way, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work. We combine our prayers, presence, gifts and service to make a significant difference in the lives of God's people”.

The finance committee feels an obligation to the conference to pay the amount we were supposed to pay in 2011. To that end we will have a special offering for the next 3 weeks to try to make up this shortfall and pay the amount owed. The special offering, above and beyond your regular giving, will be collected on January 29 and February 5th. Please use the envelopes in the pews or you could also use your regular envelope and write “special offering” so the funds can be properly processed. We will take this offering over the next 3 weeks to make it easier on the congregation. We have approximately 250 in attendance each Sunday. This amounts to \$64 per person or \$21.33 per week per person. Obviously everyone's situation is different and we realize the economy has not been good over the last few years. Please pray about how you can help. This church has always come through when times are tough and we pray this situation will be no different. God Bless You!

UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) supply kits help care for the most vulnerable people during times of crisis. They also sustain life by providing basic necessities to people who lack access to essential supplies. Your help is needed now by donating supplies for Birthing Kits. At the Northern Shore District Day of Learning, March 10, 2012, we will be offering a UMCOR workshop –“Helping Hands of God”. In this workshop those who attend will be assembling Birthing Kits that will be shipped to an UMCOR Relief Depot and used in the birthing process of babies in far off countries, where there is no availability of the items in these kits.

Supplies/items listed below are needed for each birthing kit that we will assemble together.

Items must be NEW:

- New travel size 2 -3 Oz or smaller bar soap
- A roll or large sheets of 4ml plastic to be cut at workshop on District Day of Learning (no shower curtains)
- A box of single edge razor blades (no shaving razors)
- Receiving Blankets 30x30 or 32x32 found in Wal-Mart (no fleece or flannel)
- Box of Ziploc gallon size bags
- Envelope containing \$1.00 for shipping cost
- A roll of cotton string.

All proceeds will go towards the church utilities and maintenance.
